


## Aircraft Registration

- All aircraft are required by Law to be registered.
- Each aircraft, when registered, is issued with a unique set of markings which indicate the State of Registry and identifies the specific aircraft.
- All countries that are ICAO Member States are required to maintain an Aircraft Register.
- No aircraft may fly in the airspace of any member state unless that aircraft is registered in that country or in another ICAO member state.
- Only the Director General of the CAA may Register an aircraft (Security).
- An Aircraft Register Shall contain, by Law:
  - The Nationality Markings and the Registration Markings Assigned
  - The Name of the Manufacturer of the Aircraft
  - The Type and Model Number of the Aircraft
  - The Manufacturer's Serial Number
  - The Name & Address of the Owner (Entity having Custody & Control)
- An Aircraft Register may, in addition, contain:
  - Type, model number and serial number of each engine installed.
  - A Brief History of Incidents/Accidents
  - Date of next Major Check
  - Any other information that the CAA may wish to record.
  - Date of Manufacture of the aircraft.
  - Date of Issue of the Certificate of Airworthiness (C of A).

Requirements to be met for Registration of an Aircraft:

- Proof of Ownership (Bill of Sale/Lease);
- De-Registration Certificate from last State in which the aircraft was registered; and
- Customs Clearance
- An Aircraft Register must be able to produce Reports as below:
  - Show Aircraft on Active Register (Legal to Fly).
  - Show all Aircraft with C of A expired.
  - Show all Aircraft of a specific type
  - Show all aircraft of a specific Operator
  - Show all aircraft of a specific age (Older than...)
